

## PRIMARY SCHOOL DRESS CODE

In general, clothing should be in good condition (free from holes, tears, etc.) and should not fit too tightly. Students and families are asked to use good judgement in selecting appropriate attire (no offensive language or logos, etc.) aligned with the core values of the school. Should students come to school with inappropriate attire, they will be asked to change clothes. Repeated incidents may result in loss of privileges, a phone call home, and/or required purchase of EDS apparel kept on campus.

**NOTE:** Hair must be of natural color.

### **MASKS:**

- Face masks/coverings must meet the above criteria for appropriateness when worn at school.

### **PANTS:**

- Relaxed fit or uniform style
- Solid colors: Navy, black, or khaki
- Shorts, skirts, and skorts should extend past mid-thigh.
- Solid color leggings and tights worn under skirts/dresses should be navy, black, white, or khaki.
- Dresses are permitted if they meet other guidelines.

### **SHIRTS:**

- Collared; polo style or button-down
- Solid colors
- Short- or long-sleeved
- Small logo (up to 3") is permitted.

### **COOL-WEATHER ITEMS:**

- Solid color sweaters, vests, or zip-up fleeces
- Hoods are not permitted
- A solid color, collared shirt worn underneath
- Small logo (up to 3") is acceptable.

### **FOOTWEAR:**

- Any well-kept athletic, casual, or dress shoe suitable for running and active play
- Backless shoes, Crocs, sandals, flip-flops, and high-heels are not permitted.

### **FRIDAY:**

- Jeans (blue or black) may be worn on Friday and designated "jean days."
- EDS Spirit Wear or college/university shirts (including hoodies) may be worn.
