



2021-22 COVID-19 STUDENT POLICY

FACE MASKS

Masks are required for all students and visitors.

The CDC recommends universal masking indoors, regardless of vaccination status in regions seeing case surges.

COVID SYMPTOMS

If your child exhibits symptoms that may be related to COVID-19, please keep them home. Contact the school nurse to determine next steps and when it is safe to return to school.

COVID POSITIVE

Students who test positive for COVID-19 should stay home and isolate themselves from other household members. Contact the school nurse and follow safe return protocols.

CLOSE CONTACTS IN CLASSROOM SETTING

Because masks are required indoors, no close contact quarantine is required, as long as they remain asymptomatic.

CLOSE CONTACTS OUTSIDE OF CLASSROOM

UNVACCINATED or PARTIALLY VACCINATED

Asymptomatic students who are identified as close contacts must quarantine for 5 days and get tested on day 5. They may return fully masked on days 6-10 as long as they remain asymptomatic.

FULLY VACCINATED

Those identified as close contacts should mask for 10 days in indoor public settings.

The CDC recommends vaccinated students with known exposure be tested 5 days after exposure.

WHO IS A CLOSE CONTACT?

Individuals within 3 feet when masked or 6 feet unmasked for a total of 15 minutes or more in an indoor setting within a 24-hour period is considered a close contact.

IF SYMPTOMS DEVELOP

If your child has been identified as a close contact and develops symptoms, contact the school nurse, get a PCR test, and keep them home. They will need to follow the Safe Return guidelines.
