

WHAT IS A STUDENT AMBASSADOR?

A Student Ambassador is a student leader who serves as liaison, spokesperson, and advocate for Evansville Day School. Ambassadors love their Day School experience and consistently demonstrate strong interpersonal skills, a positive attitude, and commitment to integrity. Day School Ambassadors are highly motivated and energetic, possessing effective decision making skills, the ability to motivate others, and a willingness to work as a team. A Student Ambassador embodies the attributes of Portrait of a Graduate: resilient, balanced, globally-minded, entrepreneurial learner.

Being selected as a Day School Ambassador is a privilege. Responsibilities include:

- Assisting during new student orientation.
- Welcoming prospective students and families to campus.
- Answering general questions regarding Day School's admissions process, campus/class overview, and student life.
- Helping host admissions and other community-building events as needed.
- Assisting with campus tours.
- Striving to create a positive campus atmosphere by partnering with other Day School leadership groups.
- Working with school administrators to discuss new ideas regarding recruitment and retention.

HOW MUCH TIME DOES SERVING AS A STUDENT AMBASSADOR TAKE?

Your academics and other school commitments are your first responsibility - all assignments and obligations as an Ambassador will work around your schedule. Ambassadors are required to uphold high academic standards as an example of a model Day School student.

Student Ambassadors meet once a month and are expected to volunteer at Day School events during the course of an academic year. Assignments, on-campus events, and recruitment could potentially involve weekdays, evenings, and weekends. This is a one-year commitment.

Ambassadors should attend monthly meetings and have time available for various events, tours, classroom presentations, school visits, or assigned department responsibilities/obligations. This opportunity is available for all students in Grades 7-12.
